Dear Parents & Carers

This term we are saying a big 'Thank you and Farewell' to Chris our Lead Teacher of the Deaf.

Chris is retiring after many years of teaching. She has had a varied career, taught History in secondary schools, trained as a Teacher of the Deaf working in several schools including the last 10 years at Hague. We want to say 'Thank you' to Chris for leading the Deaf Provision, supporting, children and families so well. We know it has been much appreciated as she will be missed. We know that Chris is very much looking forward to spending more time with her family and grandchildren and not being time tabled to school day and holidays.



Chris has worked with me to appoint 2 new trainee Teachers of the Deaf with the support of all deaf pupils who were involved in the interview process last term. Both teachers are fully committed to 2 years training. Kyrie Jeffreys an experienced KS2 teacher she will start at Hague in April. Kelly Hitchins, Green Class Teacher will also transfer to Hague's Deaf Provision from September. Please note she is Year 1 Class Teacher until July. Cheryl will be working with me inducting and supporting in preparation for them starting their training in the Autumn Term.

Note that there is a national shortage of qualified Teachers of the Deaf. I have met with the Tower Hamlets Heads of Service for Sensory Impairment and SEN/D, Heads of other Tower Hamlets Deaf Provisions, Culloden and St Paul's Way as well as Debbie Jones the new Director of Children's Services. So Hague like the other schools mentioned has to train teachers to meet the needs of our pupils. In Tower Hamlets we believe this is the best short and long term strategy, for TH to grow new teachers from within provision schools, as so many who qualified in the past, like Chris are now looking forward to retirement.

To Chris our Lead Teacher of Deaf. It is very sad to see her go but we wish her the very best in her future endeavours.

Easter Holidays are soon upon us. We hope everyone has some plans for fun with the family, perhaps going out and about to the park now that the warmer, sunnier weather is with us.
