



Letters have been sent out this week. Please return to John asap. Thank you.

- Children must wear Hague PE kit for each session. Failure to do so means the children are not taking part safely.
- Parents will be asked to collect children who do not have PE kit that includes trainers.
- If children miss 2 or more club sessions the place may be offered to another child.
- The school has to have maximum participation and attendance figures to show impact of School Sports Funding.

The after school clubs are currently still offered for free at Hague.

- Many schools in Tower Hamlets are now charging £2:00—£5.00 per session.
- If your child signs up for a club, they must attend for the whole course regularly.
- We will prioritise children who attend regularly, behave well, make an effort to improve fitness and skills.
- Both single working parents and working parents will be given priority for after school clubs, to support child care up to 4:30pm.
- Please make sure that your child/ren are collected on time at 4:30pm.

If you have concerns about your child's physical fitness, diet, eating habits or weight, please do talk to John or Alice as school may be able to offer further support.

HEALTHY SCHOOL GOLD CHOICES AT HAGUE

As a member of the Tower Hamlets Healthy Schools with Gold Award, we want pupils learn how to make healthy lifestyle choices.

PARENTS: Please support children by offering fresh fruit or raw vegetables like carrot or cucumber sticks and water after school as a quick refreshment— if needed.



Too many children in Tower Hamlets and in Hague playground are observed having sweets, crisps, biscuits, ice-cream on the way home. This affects teeth and weight.

Hague School's Healthy Eating Policy is:

No sweets, crisps, chocolate, chewing gum or sugary drinks on trips, in school, in the playground before or after school.

We ask parents to respect this and keep them for occasional treats at home.

At Hague we do not have birthday cakes, sweets or party bag gifts.

Children's birthdays are celebrated and recognised in assembly each week.

This saves families money and stops the pressure from children to buy things for up to 30 children.

Teachers do not host parties or give out treats in line with risk assessments for allergies and healthy eating.

We have Eid and Xmas parties with occasional events which permit treats for all. **Please support and respect our efforts.**
